

COLONEL JUDY D. STOLTMANN

Colonel Judy D. Stoltmann is the Commander, 55th Medical Group, 55th Wing, Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska. She is responsible for a four-squadron, 612-person health care delivery system providing care to more than 48,000 Department of Defense beneficiaries. She oversees the post-graduate education and training of more than 150 medical and dental personnel annually, to include the 55th Medical Group Family Medicine Residency and Dental Residency Programs. Additionally, she serves as the principal medical advisor to the 55th Wing Commander and is responsible for providing comprehensive health services to maintain the highest degree of readiness in support of contingency war mobilization and Homeland Defense plans for Offutt Air Force Base, 50 associate units, U.S. Strategic Command and the Air Force Weather Agency.

Colonel Stoltmann had 10 years civilian nursing experience before commissioning in the Air Force in 1993. She has held positions in a variety of health care settings including inpatient, ambulatory care,



urgent care, health promotions and health care integration. She is board certified as a Public/Community Health Clinical Nurse Specialist.

Col Stoltmann commanded the 366th Surgical Operations Squadron, the 509th Medical Group and the 380th Expeditionary Medical Group. In addition, she served as Chief Nurse Executive at various times throughout her career. Prior to her assignment as the commander of the 380th Expeditionary Medical Group, Colonel Stoltmann served as the Chief of Medical Operations and Command Nurse at Air Force Global Strike Command Surgeon General's office.
