Col. George Marty "Moose" Reynolds is the Commander, 55th Wing, Offutt AFB, Neb. He is responsible for organizing, training, and equipping six groups and 31 squadrons executing worldwide intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance; electronic attack; command and control; presidential support; and treaty verification missions. He is also responsible for base support to more than 50 associate units, including U.S. Strategic Command, 557th Weather Wing, and more than 57,000 active-duty members, civilians, family members and retirees.

Colonel Reynolds received his commission in 1992 from the United States Air Force Academy. He has served in a variety of flying, staff and command assignments. His staff assignments include the Tanker Airlift Control Center, Twelfth Air Force (Air Forces Southern), and the Joint Staff. He has commanded the 55th Electronic Combat Group, 42d Electronic Combat Squadron, Davis-Monthan Air Force Base, Ariz.; 43d Expeditionary Electronic Combat Squadron, Southwest Asia; and 755th Expeditionary Electronic Combat Squadron, U.S. Southern Command Area of Operations.



Colonel Reynolds is an evaluator pilot with more than 2,300 flying hours in the RC-135V/W, EC-130E/H, C-130E/H, T-38 and T-37. He is authorized to wear the senior weather occupational badge.
