





What is sexual harassment?

IAW Dodi 1020.03 & AFI 36-2710

 Any deliberate or repeated unwelcomed verbal comment or gesture of a sexual nature by any member of the armed forces or civilian employee of the Department of Defense. For example, sexual advances, request for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature constitutes sexual harassment; When this conduct explicitly or implicitly affects an individual's employment, unreasonably interferes with an individual's work performance, or creates an intimidating, hostile, or offensive work environment.

Sexual harassment can occur in a variety of circumstances, including but not limited to the following:

- The victim, as well as the harasser, may be a woman or a man. The victim does not have to be of the opposite sex.
- The harasser can be the victim's supervisor, an agent of the employer, a supervisor in another area, a co-worker, or a non-employee.
- The victim does not need to be the person harassed, but could be anyone affected by the offensive conduct.
- Unlawful sexual harassment may occur without economic injury or discharge of the victim.
- The harasser's conduct must be unwelcomed/unwanted.

What do I do if I am sexually harassed?

 It is helpful for the victim to inform the harasser directly that the conduct IS unwelcomed/ unwanted and must stop; however is not necessary.
