COLONEL PHILIP F. ACQUARO

Col. Philip F. Acquaro is the Commander, 55th Electronic Combat Group, Davis-Monthan Air Force Base, Arizona. He is responsible for organizing, training and equipping five squadrons of over 850 Airmen to provide combat-ready EC-130H Compass Call aircraft, aircrew and maintainers for worldwide expeditionary deployment in support of the unified combatant commanders.

Col. Acquaro earned his commission as a graduate from the United States Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado, in 1995. After graduation from Joint Undergraduate Navigator Training in 1996, he was assigned as an Electronic Warfare Officer to the RC-135V/W Rivet Joint. In June 2001, he cross trained into the EC-130H Compass Call and graduated Weapons School in December 2003. Following his graduation from Naval Postgraduate School in December 2007, he was assigned to Headquarters Air Force Plans and Programs Directorate. He returned to the EC-130H in February 2011 as the 41st Electronic Combat Squadron Director of Operations. He also served as the 41st Expeditionary Electronic Combat Squadron Commander at Bagram Air Base, Afghanistan leading EC-130H operations in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. In September 2012, he commanded the 42nd Electronic Combat Squadron, the EC-130H Formal Training Unit, where he led 55 instructors and 150 squadron personnel responsible for the Programmed Flying Training of 200 students in nine crew positions and the execution of 22 Air Combat Command syllabi. Prior to his current position, Col. Acquaro was the Operations Directorate Current Actions Branch Chief, United States European Command Headquarters, Stuttgart Germany.
