Col. Alan Dayton serves as the Commander, 55th Mission Support Group, 55th Wing, Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska. He leads a diverse group across five squadrons that support Air Combat Command's largest wing and 50 associate units, including United States Strategic Command and the 557th Weather Wing. The group provides mobility processing to deploy over 3,000 personnel per year, a \$5 billion contracting portfolio, manpower and personnel, and services to 57,000 active duty, dependent and retired personnel.

Col. Dayton is a 1995 distinguished graduate of Air Force ROTC at North Carolina State University. He has multiple operational deployments, flying combat and combat support missions in Kosovo, Afghanistan, and Iraq. He served as an undergraduate navigator training instructor and an Air Force Presidential Advance Agent. He also served as the command electronic warfare officer for both III Corps Artillery and II Marine Expeditionary Force in Iraq. Following an Air Officer Commanding tour at the U.S. Air Force Academy, he commanded the 82nd Reconnaissance Squadron employing reconnaissance aircraft throughout the Pacific Theater.



Prior to his current position, Col. Dayton served in a variety of staff assignments, to include the Joint Staff and Air Combat Command, and deployed as the Joint Air Component Coordination Element for Operation Inherent Resolve.
