




41st Electronic Combat Sq

- Deploy combat-ready EC-130H crews to unified combatant commanders: CENTCOM & EUCOM
- Develop and refine EA TTPs to combat emerging threats
- Mentor and grow the next generation of Air Force Leaders
- ORIGIN: WWI, 4th Balloon Sq, 13 Nov 1917; Re-designated as 41 ECS 17 Jun 1980

42 Electronic Combat Sq

- "Train Professional Aviators" in 11 different crew positions and instructor upgrades as the Air Forces sole EC-130H Formal Training Unit (FTU)
- Graduate approximately 200 students a year
- Support with training, deployed manpower & reach back support
- Provide qualified experts to support AF & DoD requirements
- ORIGIN: WWII, 42d Recon Sq, 24 Oct 1945 42d Tactical Electronic Warfare Squadron (Vietnam); Re-designated as 42 ECS, 9 Mar 2006











43 Electronic Combat Sq

- Provide combat-ready Airmen, delivering electronic attack at a moment's notice anywhere: esp. PACOM
- Execute initial and continuation training for 140 Airmen while supporting overseas contingency ops
- Deliver premier Electronic Attack in support of national security objectives across the ROMO
- ORIGIN: WWI: 86th Aero Sq, 17 Aug 1917; Re-designated 43 ECS 6 Jun 1986







- Supports world-wide combat mission and contingency taskings
- Directs operational support functions including plans, exercises, cryptologic training, ECG scheduling and weapons and tactics for five EC-130H COMPASS CALL squadrons
- Performs information warfare analysis, targeting and intelligence activities and conducts mission support for aircrew mission planning and combat system software







- Provide safe, reliable COMPASS CALL aircraft in support of 55 ECG operations and training
- Plans and executes all on-equipment aircraft maintenance actions for 14 EC-130H and one non-PME EC-130H aircraft
- Focuses efforts on training and equipping the world's best maintainers for future operations


Aircraft & Hardware

- Flight Time
 - 7 Hours (Unrefueled)
 - Limited by duty day (Air Refueled)
- Extensive Communication Systems

Strengths & Challenges

- Strengths:
 - Representation at HAF for QRCs which easily modify our aircraft combat effectiveness
- Challenges:
 - LDHD asset Air Force's only Electronic Attack Aircraft and only 15 in the world
 - Lack of funding and program uncertainty
 - Divestiture
 - Cross-deck (EC-X)
 - Average aircraft age 45+ years old
